Built on the principles of ABA, Relational Frame theory is a modern-day approach to language and cognition. At the core of communication deficits for children with autism, is generativity—put simply, the ability to produce or understand totally new sentences. Language develops as we build relationships between things we know and things we encounter. Deriving these relationships is critical and often a deficit for children with autism. Our curriculum and assessment is built upon the principles of RFT, addressing this relational deficit, setting us apart from traditional ABA programs.
