

EARLY INTERVENTION & "OUT OF SCHOOL" YOUTH PROGRAM

EARLY INTERVENTION

Easterseals Central and Southeast Ohio provides help to young children with or at risk for developmental delays. We help children with disabilities achieve their goals in cognitive, social/emotional, communicative, adaptive, and physical development.

Easterseals is a center-based early intervention program with access to group-oriented, facilitybased curricula for children 12 to 36 months of age. Our Early Intervention program focuses on a child's needs early on in their development at their individual level of ability, giving them the head start they need to keep up with their peers.

An individualized plan is developed for each child and their family, outlining goals to be focused on with their team. Classroom size is limited to eight children with one certified early intervention specialist and teacher's assistant per classroom. Students work with trained physical, occupational, speech, and music therapists.





Out-of-School Youth Program Quick Facts:

- IT'S FREE! Thanks to the Franklin County Commissioners, there is no tuition cost to families, and priority is given to Essential Workers and to those who qualify for TANF benefits (SNAP, cash assistance, etc.)
- □ Nutritious lunch & snacks are provided daily, at no cost
- Participants must be in Kindergarten to 4th grade to attend
- Bussing will be provided to and from Finland Elementary each day for children of families living within a 3-4 mile radius from the school
- □ Low student to staff ratios, 2:8 Staff/Student



DISCOVERY GARDEN/CHANCE TO DANCE/OGIL

CHANCE TO DANCE

The mission of Chance to Dance is to make sure the students appreciate the art of movement through rhythmic ability and to use various music as well as imaginative play. We strive for our students to enjoy the class and develop a love for dance. These dance classes provide the opportunity for kids with disabilities a CHANCE to DANCE.

In-Person and virtual classes are offered completely FREE to families. During the in-person classes, we provide the costumes, shoes, props, supplies, and music. For the virtual classes, we use items that anyone can find around their home. In keeping with the tradition of dance studios, we have two recitals a year (winter and spring). Chance to Dance also gets invited to participate in several community functions throughout the year.




DISCOVERY GARDEN

Our Discovery Garden program offers weekly gatherings that engage children in age-appropriate activities in-line with their ages & stages. It also offers support to parents seeking advice on how to best care for their families.



OHIO GOVERNOR'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY
