Interaction with family, friends, and loved ones is vital to a child's development, especially for children with special needs. Knowing how important this is, our Early Intervention program hosted a Family Day and invited parents and loved ones into the classroom for a day of fun and activities together.

### **Family Fun**

To keep a strong connection with children's families, the Early Intervention program offers Family Day twice a year – in the spring and in the fall.

The day is structured to give families an idea of what a typical day is like in their child's classroom. Teachers set up stations for the families to work through activities with their child. Each station has a written explanation of what the activity is and what developmental area it works on. A goal of the Early Intervention program is to provide parents with the tools they need to mimic activities in the classroom at home. This allows parents to get involved in their child's development and help their child grow and become more independent.

Family Day is also the program staffs way of saying thank you to the families for their support. The special day gives them an opportunity to enjoy time with their child and meet other families and children in the program too.
