In the last several months, our Adult Day program in Mt. Vernon has been experiencing growth as they spread the word about Easterseals and our program in Knox County. Our Adult Inclusion Coordinator, Michael-Ann Cox, is committed to engaging the community with individuals in our program.

"I feel that community inclusion and engagement is important as it helps with building relationships, fosters creativity, helps maintain and fulfill our life's purpose and provides individuals with choosing their life's journey", says Michael-Ann.

Providing enrichment while supporting an individual's independence is something we strive for daily at Easterseals.

The Mt. Vernon community has been very receptive to the program and has donated needed arts and craft supplies or raffle items for community events. Mt. Vernon High School, and their librarian, Keith Cawrse, have been instrumental in helping us maintain our Little Free Library and have provided great reading material for our individuals.

The program hosts monthly community events that are free to the public and people of all abilities. Each event provides dinner, various activities, and the opportunity to interact with Easterseals families and staff.

The program has also added several new recreational items such as games, a floor piano, a badminton set, cornhole and several other fun and engaging activities that everyone seems to really enjoy. With the new direction, our program in Mt. Vernon has gained 6 new individuals since the end of July 2017, including an individual with Alzheimer's disease.

Jonathan and Dustin had the opportunity to visit South Point Elementary School and read to the first grade class.


When asked about his experience reading to the students, Jonathan said, "I liked seeing the little kids faces and they listened really well.

The students at South Point Elementary also benefitted from the experience as it develops an understanding of self and others, and encourages respect for the feelings and rights of other individuals, regardless of their ability.

Dustin said, "It was awesome to read to the kids." Our staff strive to provide activities such as this on a daily basis to ensure that individuals in our program have the opportunity to engage and
