Community in Motion

Hundreds Rally for Bike and Run for the Kids Events

ore than 1,000 people biked, walked, volunteered, ran or rolled between the Bike for the Kids (August 27) and Run for the Kids: Superhero Hustle (September 30). Both events boasted record-setting attendance and surpassed fundraising goals.

Thanks to participants, sponsors and supporters, combined net proceeds from these events totaled more than \$103,000!

Many reached physical and fundraising milestones at these events. Parker, has worked hard in physical therapy to build strength and endurance. He proved his progress by cycling 25 miles with his Physical Therapist, Josephine. Adapted bike recipients, Abbie, Camden, Colton, Jayden, Maya and Ting led the children's pedal parade, joyfully riding their new bikes along Elgin's Fox River Trail.

For Tiffany Olson, the 20th Anniversary of the Run for the Kids was motivation to set a \$20,000 fundraising goal. Eleven years ago, the Olsons participated in their first Run for the Kids with daughter, Brinley, who was born with a partially formed brain, tethered spinal cord, extra fingers and toes, and low muscle tone. After witnessing children take their first steps at the finish line, the family was moved by the community

they'd found at Easterseals and their hope for Brinley.

"I walked through the doors and I didn't feel alone. I felt like all of Brinley's challenges became her (Easterseals) team's challenges to overcome. And overcome they did. This girl who wasn't supposed to walk or talk did. In fact, she took her first steps here at Easterseals. Today, she ran across the finish line, just as she's done the last handful of years. And the poignancy of that moment is never lost on me." - Tiffany Olson

Since joining the Run for the Kids in 2011, The Brincredibles have become enthusiastic participants and top fundraisers. Their efforts have raised nearly \$150,000 to help empower other families at Easterseals DuPage & Fox Valley. The Olsons are grateful to all the professionals at Easterseals who gave them support and belief that Brinley would reach greater independence.



How 708 Boards Make A Difference

708 Boards or Community Mental Health Boards have mobilized throughout our service area to help support mental health, disability, and substance abuse services for residents. Support from voters directs local tax dollars to causes like Easterseals who impact the overall health of the community.

Bloomingdale Township was the first township in DuPage County to form a Mental Health Board. Since its start in 2017, the Bloomingdale Township Mental Health Board has granted Easterseals \$340,000 to support pediatric rehabilitation therapies, programs, and mental health services. We are grateful for this transformational funding, and the example Bloomingdale Township has set for other local municipalities.

Our gratitude extends to all the 708 Community Mental Health Boards to fund Easterseals including, Bloomingdale Township, Dundee Township, Hanover Township, Milton Township, and St. Charles Mental Health Board.

The American Medical Association (AMA) recently passed Resolution 706, "Caring for Neurodivergent Patients," which fundamentally recognizes the diversity and personhood of individuals with autism. This resolution is a big step forward for the neurodiverse community and aligns with our philosophy that evidence-based efforts and neurodiversity-affirming care should be at the forefront of all medical services.

At Easterseals, our evidence-based services incorporate the benefits of DIR/Floortime (DIR®) into our occupational therapy, speech language and mental health support services for children with autism.
