Course Description/Target Audience:

This one day course is designed to provide therapists with extensive hands on treatment recommendations pertaining to the implications of torticollis. Current evidence-based clinical pathways and guidelines for management of torticollis will be discussed and incorporated during several lab sessions, including discussion and lab related to cervical mobilizations to address the persistent head tilt lingering in many toddlers.

Current functional, clinically oriented evaluation and evidence based treatment strategies for infants and young children that can be integrated into routines and play will be provided. Emphasis on home exercise programs and effective strategies to team with parents will be explored.

Learning opportunities will transpire through case reports, group problem solving, video review, live patient demonstration, lab practicums, and minimal lecture. The extensive use of pictures and videos will allow participates to problem solve and identify movement and tissue impairments related to the diagnosis of torticollis.

Due to the advanced nature of this course, all participants are required to take the preceding 2-day "Torticollis & Plagiocephaly" course or have attended a 2-day torticollis course in the past 5 years. Precourse reading is required and will be sent following registration.

Target Audience:

Pediatric Physical & Occupational Therapists who have taken a 2-day Torticollis course in the last 5 years. Precourse reading will be suggested.

About the Instructors:

Having served the pediatric population since 1977, **Cindy Miles, PT, PhD. PCS, CNDT** established her pediatric private practice in 1981. Dr. Miles is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, School of Health Related Professionals and East Stroudsburg University with a Master of Education in exercise physiology. She also holds a PhD in Pediatric Science from the Rocky Mountain University of Health Professions. Her doctoral research was on



potential risk factors related to the diagnosis of Torticollis. She is Board Certified by the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties as a Pediatric Clinical Specialist, specializing in treating children from birth through to young adults. Cindy completed the eight week Pediatric NeuroDevelopmental training course and the Advanced Infant course. Dr. Miles is serving as President of the Academy of Pediatric Physical Therapy (APPT) and is presently the Co-Chair and Meeting Planner for the Academy's Annual Conference (APPTAC). She held the titles of APPT Treasurer, Treasurer Elect and pediatric sports, fitness SIG chair. Dr. Miles presents nationally on pediatric private practice and reimbursement as well as nationally and internationally on Torticollis, Plagiocephaly, and Fitness for All Abilities.
