Course Description:

Every year there seems to be an increase in children with attention and behavior issues. There can be various underlying causes. This resource-filled, 6.5-hour course explains how improving basic developmental skills can significantly impact attention and academic skills. Topics covered include (1) explanations and strategies for visual perception and how vision can impact learning that can be done as a home exercise program or at school; (2) a screening process, compensation techniques, and exercises for retained primitive reflexes that can be done in a variety of settings; (3) classroom and home implementation of strategies for the sensory system; and (4) the use of technology compensation techniques, including the use of iPads and Chromebooks. Each section ends with sample goals for that topic. Overall, an abundance of strategies are provided, including over 50 apps, that you can use the very next day!

<u>Target Audience:</u> Introductory- to intermediate-level occupational therapists and other professionals, including physical therapists, speech-language pathologists, social workers, teaching staff, & school administrators.
