Vision supports regulation, movement, anticipatory action, balance, play, and learning. Babies born at risk for, or with neurological problems, often have visual challenges that complicate the developmental challenges. Learning strategies to simultaneously address motor and vision and play in your treatment will result in more effective outcomes, enhance neuroplasticity and functional improvement in the baby's sensory motor development. Ideas for teaching parents strategies that can be embedded into their family routines will be included.

- Understand clinical assessment aspects of vision development in infancy as it relates to motor and play behaviors.
- Identify and understand common issues in neurologically involved babies affecting visual behavior: acuity, neglect, eye turns, torticollis, posture, engagement, cortical visual impairment, oculomotor control.
- Review evidence based literature supporting strategies for integration of vision with movement and play.
- Identify practical treatment strategies of what we can do as therapists to incorporate the vision with movement and play goals using case examples emphasizing handling, environment structure, activity choices and objects, as well as interaction.

at-risk babies in the Neonatal Developmental Follow-Up Clinic for Good Samaritan Hospital. Ms. Ryan has been an OT NDT instructor for the 8-week pediatric course since 1990. She has also published articles relating to UE/hand function, as well as co-authored chapters on assessment and treatment of infants with neurological impairments.
