# **Finding A Center of Excellence**

Brynn is a happy and playful two-year-old who enjoys animals, cheese, time with her family, and new independence at local parks. At her one-year-old well visit, Brynn's pediatrician discussed referring for physical therapy to address Brynn's low muscle tone (hypotonia). Upon receiving that news, her mother, Lisa said,

"I asked for a referral to Easterseals right away. It was the only place I wanted her to go because it is a center of excellence."

Before services at Easterseals, Brynn scooted, but did not walk, crawl or pull herself up to stand. Now, she has caught up in many areas and is performing age-appropriate activities like squatting and jumping. Her family is thankful for their experience with Easterseals clinicians who they describe as dedicated, knowledgeable and motivating. Brynn especially enjoys the many fun activities with her physical therapist, Jenna, and shouts her name eagerly as soon as they turn into the Easterseals parking lot.

Lisa shares, "Starting physical therapy services made a big impact. Most people who encounter Brynn today would not know she receives therapy services. I think that is partially because of the excellent therapy she's received. She's catching up to her peers."

### **Mental Health Spaces for Care and Play**

Our mental health and family support services department has grown to include a psychologist, care coordinator and six social workers. The team has created new therapy spaces designed around many different modalities of play. Each space features toys for imaginative play, board games and art supplies to support child-led and play-based sessions. A special art room offers slime recipes, crafts and a museum spot to share and celebrate new creations. For children who need help with regulation, there are sensory spaces with swings and mats along with reading nooks and weighted blankets.

These unique spaces facilitate connections through fun and exploration. By keying into each child's interests, families are experiencing positive outcomes.






## Giving it our All
