Guiding Families Through a Pandemic

Providing Answers & Support

Easterseals DuPage & Fox Valley has provided tele-therapy for more than 10 years. Within two days of the statewide shelter-in-place order, all 87 therapists and our social services team completed an extensive tele-therapy training led by Director of Speech-Language, Feeding, & Assistive Technology, Valerie Heneghan. This training ensured that our team was well prepared to continue helping families from home.

At the time of the shutdown, five-year-old John was preparing for his start to kindergarten with the help of therapies at Easterseals. Change is challenging for John, who has autism, and being home without his usual activities was hard for his family. When his services shifted to tele-therapy, John's parents were glad that Valerie was there to help with the transition.

John's therapy services grew to include occupational therapy as well. He developed the same strong connection with his new therapist, Meg. even though they have only met through the screen. She worked to truly understand his interests and body language, and individualizes each session to meet John's needs, interests and therapy goals. He logs on each week ready to learn and play!

His speech-language therapy sessions are full of online resources and games that keep him engaged and interested in learning. It can take longer for John to process requests, especially if he is being asked to respond to multiple questions and instructions at once. Valerie has taught John's family key strategies that have helped them communicate more effectively. His family also gained an understanding of how John's sensory needs impact his communication skills. John's Occupational Therapist, Meg, has identified many ways to provide the sensory input John's body needs so he can focus and enhance his ability to communicate and learn.

His mom, Katherine, shares: "We have found that the therapists at Easterseals stand apart as they are specialized to work with children with different needs. When our son is doing his tele-therapy sessions, the attention is solely on our son and learning about how he operates as an individual. The therapists at Easterseals have taught us so much about autism and how to best accommodate and interact with our son to enrich all of our lives. We are so grateful to have them guide our family through the beginning stages of our autism journey."

While the start to kindergarten looks different than John's family imagined, they are grateful that Easterseals has provided the tools and skills to help him grow and learn.

Community Response to COVID-19

The community response to the pandemic has made it possible for us to re-imagine our service model, reposition our operations and address some of our most critical needs. Before Illinois instated its stay-at-home order, our clinical team quickly expanded our tele-therapy program which allowed families to continue their services without interruption.

With continued guidance from the CDC, local public health departments and expert epidemiologists, we gradually reopened our three centers with new safety procedures while continuing to offer tele-therapy. Emergency relief funds from our community have been essential. From technology upgrades for tele-therapy support to personalized protective equipment (PPE) for our clinicians, local foundations have helped ensure the healthy outcomes for our clients, their families, and our staff.

As an organization serving a vulnerable population, we need to be extremely conscientious. Without the appropriate masks, shields, and gowns, our staff would not have been able to come back. We would not have been able to open without it.

Additional grant funding has also allowed us to support our families' mental health needs while at home. When children's behaviors became more disruptive at home, remote learning seemed impossible, or anxiety over family members' compromised immune systems became overwhelming to navigate, we provided assistance and solutions. Families are finding with all the uncertainty in their children's lives, we are their constant.

Vicki wrote me to share this very thought, and her gratitude for our tele-therapy services for her sixteen-year-old daughter. "Kate will not be returning to school and we are now depending on Easterseals even more. Thank you for being our constant during all of this. Her therapists are so kind and

understanding. Without Easterseals we know Kate would have regressed."

We are bolstered by your support and the signal it sends. Our community is still here for us.
