LEAP Program expands to year-round



The summer LEAP Program in Berks County has been expanded to a year-round opportunity for teens and young adults ages 13-22 years to participate in career, volunteer, and recreational

experiences in the community.

LEARNING ENRICHMENT AND PARTNERSHIPS

LEAP Job Club is held at the John Paul II Center for Special Learning on Tuesday afternoons. Participants gain an introduction to career options after high school graduation with a focus on resume development, interviewing skills, and job search techniques.

LEAP Community Network introduces participants to a variety of volunteer, vocational, and social opportunities with an emphasis on volunteering, job shadowing, employer visits, and recreational opportunities.

There will also be four informational sessions for families to meet representatives from the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation, Service Access and Management, Goodwill Industries, and service providers in the county to learn about funding, programs, and processes. The LEAP program will also offer a Leadership Summit in 2016 where participants will develop their leadership skills, team building, and establish a plan for next steps upon graduation.

Nadia Lozano - in her own words – tells you how Easter Seals helps change lives.

My name is Nadia Lozano. When I was 9 months old I was diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy (CP). For those who are unsure what that is, CP refers to a group of neurological disorders that appear in infancy or early childhood and permanently affect body movement and muscle coordination. It is caused by damage to or abnormalities inside the developing brain that disrupt the brain's ability to control movement and maintain posture and balance.



When I was diagnosed with CP, my parents were

scared and didn't know what to do because I was their first child. The pediatrician who diagnosed me referred my parents to Easter Seals. I spent almost the first 5 years of my life with Easter Seals. There I learned how to do just about everything from sitting, walking, crawling and learning how to feed myself. Easter Seals was the best thing that happened to me during this time because everyone else thought I would never be able to do anything. But Easter Seals believed in me and helped my parents through this time of need.

After Easter Seals, I went to school, where I was included in regular classrooms and was able to be just one of the kids. My parents always treated me the same as my younger sisters. My father taught me how to ride a bike and swim by the time I was 8 years old. I was able to walk without a walker, crutches and wheelchair by the time I was 14 years old. I also got my driver's license at age 17. I graduated from high school and then from DeSales University with a BA in Business Management.

For the last five years, I have been a landlord and I love it. For 2 years, I worked at the Lehigh Valley Center for Independent Living (LVCIL), which is a non-profit organization that serves people with disabilities, and their family members, living in Lehigh and Northampton Counties. I worked there as a Strategic Community Building Coordinator. I did outreach and trained people in the community about disabilities and helped them understand that people with disabilities want to, and can, be independent. As of now, I have been married for a year and we just bought our first home.

I am thankful for everything I have because Easter Seals was able to help me learn the basic skills you need in life that so many take for granted. Easter Seals believed in me and saw what I could do. They helped my parents create a life for me that led me to where I am today. I will always be thankful for them and I want to thank everyone who has it in their heart to help support Easter Seals. You can't image the gift you are giving to children and their families until someone you know needs their services.
