

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT & CHAIR OF EASTERSEALS FLORIDA

THERE ARE NO HOURS OR DAYS IN CORONATIME...

If 2021 had a theme for Easterseals Florida, it would have to be "resilience."

We did not think we would still be living with the pandemic, but on it goes. Throughout, we continued to keep our sense of community and took focused measures to maintain the health of our staff and clients. With strict safety standards in place, our programs remained open, and our spirits strengthened with the strong presence of our clients.

Over the course of time, we saw children lose ground in learning, caregivers and family members were exhausted, and our Camp Challenge campers missed each other and their friendships. While the reunions were emotional and moving, they were also very important for everyone's spirit, health, and wellbeing. We learned that we are stronger than we realized, and we are more resilient than we knew. We were humbled to learn just how important Easterseals is in the everyday lives of our clients; and despite our weariness, we forged ahead, never forgetting our mission.

With the joy we experienced in the loosening of restrictions, our beloved fundraising events unfortunately experienced yet another year, without in person events. However, we persisted, and our donors and supporters stayed by our side.

During the past two years of pandemic life, Easterseals flourished. While some organizations and businesses closed, we grew by a remarkable 49%. The State of Florida, Department of Health came to Easterseals and asked us to serve Miami Dade and Monroe Counties by expanding our Early Steps program. We already serve Palm Beach, St. Lucie, Martin, Indian River and Okeechobee Counties, so we were delighted to embrace thousands more infants and toddlers experiencing developmental delays into our programs. In Orange County, the Children's Commission awarded Easterseals five programs, ranging from behavioral health for children to a senior activity center. Funders and donors trust Easterseals and we take that responsibility very seriously.

We met another organizational milestone this year through the establishment of The Dreyfuss Family Endowment! Jody and Kathy Dreyfuss challenged us to raise one million dollars, which they pledged to match. We completed our challenge and now have an enriching and sustainable fund to continue to innovate and meet the ever-changing needs of our community.









MEET JOE

Joe Kaiser, a Navy Veteran, came to the Miller Center in December of 2020. During the initial interview with his wife, son, and Joe, the main concern was that he was spending much of his day sleeping, and showed little or no interest in any activities. His wife told us that one thing that Joe enjoyed was talking to people.

She had been to several facilities in the area, but had not found one that felt right. They were all too clinical looking. They decided to try the Miller Center, mainly because of the friendliness of the staff and the comfortable setting. Letting us know, that should he not be happy, they wanted to be sure that they could withdraw and there was no contracted time. We were able to assure her that was certainly the case.

The first few days were a bit of a challenge, as Joe tried to find ways to leave, often setting off an alarm. Interestingly, his wife said that he told her he had a good day, how nice the staff was and that he enjoyed talking to people. She did say, though, that he could not tell her what he had done during the day, only that he talked to people and the staff was nice. This went on for a few months months, then Joe started asking his wife if she "could drop him off at the Miller Center" even on weekends. From that he started telling her about events we had, high school student speakers, a bag pipe player, a vocalist, and even what movie we watched. Shortly after, his neurologist suggested that adding days would be in Joe's best interest, so he is now coming to us Monday through Friday. When we go to get him from the car, he quickly heads to the door to begin his day.

Joe enjoys joking with the staff, and feels very comfortable interacting with them. He says it is like one big family, that everyone gets along..... We are not saying that miracles happened, but are saying that his family is convinced thathis time with us has had a very positive effect on his quality of life, and that is close enough for them.



PROGRAMS & SERVICES



Serving 40 of Florida's 67 Counties

LIVE - ADULT DAY HEALTH CARE, NAVIGATORS, EARLY STEPS

ADULT DAY HEALTH CARE

Easterseals Florida provides adult day health care services to people who have disabilities such as Alzheimer's disease, dementia, Parkinson's disease, traumatic brain injury, cognitive disorders, or other special needs. At Easterseals' Adult Day Health Centers, members engage in fitness, therapeutic arts and wellness activities, and social activities daily, all monitored by health care professionals.

FIT BEHAVIORAL THERAPY

This program is an in-home BCBA service that will include individual and family therapy utilizing a parent educational concept that will assist the family to help their child as they grow and develop. Serving children up to 22 years of age, this program serves Orange County's* most underserved communities and our team is trained to offer therapy services in both English and Spanish.

*This program is funded in full or part by Orange County, Florida.

DISABILITY NAVIGATOR PROGRAM

Easterseals' Disability Resource Navigator Program helps parents and their children (up to age 22) find the services your loved one needs to achieve developmental milestones, stay healthy, and thrive in the community. Our Disability Navigators connect you directly to the resources you need by conducting developmental screenings for children up to age 5 to identify areas of need, providing case management and referrals, and offering community education sessions on disability-related topics. All Disability Navigator Program services are provided at no cost to families living in Orange County.



Early Steps is Florida's early intervention system that offers services to eligible children, birth to thirty-six months, with significant developmental delays or a condition likely to result in a developmental delay. Easterseals Early Steps early intervention is provided to support families and caregivers in developing the competence and confidence to help their child learn and develop. Services are provided to the family and child where they live, learn and play, to enable the family to implement developmentally appropriate learning opportunities during everyday activities and routines. Our two service areas include Treasure Coast Early Steps (Palm Beach, Marin, St. Lucie, Indian River, and Okeechobee Counties) and the Southernmost Coast Early Steps (South Miami Dade and Monroe Counties)





CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTERS

Easterseals Florida's Child Development Centers provide inclusive, high-quality child care and developmental programming for children with disabilities, as well as typically developing children, from birth to five years of age. Based upon each child's needs, services are provided and accommodations are made for therapy and other services to occur during the school day in a familiar environment to promote growth, learning, and success for children.

PLAY PROJECT

The PLAY Project is an in-home, intensive play based early intervention program for children on the autism spectrum. Through parent training, we empower families to work on intervention skills, at home, through PLAY.



LEAP

The Life Skills, Employment Readiness, Advocacy, and Participation (LEAP) program makes the transition from school to adulthood a better experience for young adults with disabilities and their families. LEAP program participants engage in community based educational, volunteer, and work opportunities that enhance both social and job skill development.

WORK - EMPLOYMENT SERVICES, ADULT DAY TRAINING, STRIVE

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES AND ADULT DAY TRAINING

Easterseals Florida partners with Vocational Rehabilitation to assist individuals with disabilities or special needs in securing and maintaining employment with preemployment skill building, job placement, and ongoing support after gaining employment. For those for whom community based employment is not an option, we offer an Adult Day Training program that provides work and training opportunities at our center and classes that prepare students to enter the workforce and live as independently as possible through hands-on activities that teach life skills.



STRIVE IN HOSPITALITY

Easterseals Florida's S.T.R.I.V.E. (Skill Training Results in Vocational Employment) in Hospitality program assists individuals with disabilities or other special needs gain the skills needed for employment in the hospitality and tourism industry. The program is a 12-week skills training course,

Rehabilitation, in which students have the opportunity to earn Guest Services Gold, Guest Room Attendant, and Front Desk Representative internationally in dustry-recognized certifications. This program serves individuals aged 15 to 22 years of age living in Orange County* and virtually.

CAMP CHALLENGE

Camp Challenge offers children and adults with disabilities a chance to enjoy outdoor recreation, socialize, and become more independent as they sleep away from home and are able to make decisions and participate in their own plan of care. At Camp Challenge, every activity is adapted to the needs of the camper, from swimming, sports, and zip lines to bathrooms, medication administration, and dietary needs. With opportunities to enjoy weekend camps throughout the year, winter break camp, and 6 weeks of summer camp, there are sure to be good times for campers and a little break for families and caregivers.



VOCATIONAL REHAB - VIRTUAL VIRTUAL PRE-EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

As part of Easterseals Florida's Employment Services offerings, we provide several virtual services to clients referred by Vocational Rehabilitation in order to address the needs of individuals in light of the COVID pandemic. These services take place in a virtual classroom setting and have been provided remotely to clients all over the state. Skills such as resume writing, interview preparedness, self-advocacy, and navigating the job search process are all taught through our curriculum that has been approved by Vocational Rehabilitation. Video conferencing and new online educational platforms enable us to provide these services in a fun, interactive way while allowing clients to learn from the comfort of their own homes.


