YEAR IN REVIEW

2022 was a year filled with new opportunities and experiences for our many clients throughout the community. Thanks to your support, Easterseals has been able to continue responding to the ever-changing needs of our community.







- We provided 10 weeks of summer programming, ensuring that children had fun, innovative summer programming and parents were able to maintain their work schedules.
- We provided **a** respite camp experience to 132 individuals, ensuring that caregivers had a break from the rigors of 24 hour care giving.
- Our Child Development Center continued to grow into our new beautiful space and by the end of the year had doubled the children served from 60 to 120.
- Our Brain Health program continues to grow and is now housed in the beautiful Rick Tollakson Wellness Center at Camp Sunnyside.
- Our Crisis Stabilization Program continues to fill a critical need for emergency brain health services in Polk County. In the 2021-2022 fiscal year, 320 children and adults were supported through this life-saving program.
- 97 clients obtained employment with our support.
- Easterseals lowa served over 2,960 clients throughout the state
- Our services continue to adapt and evolve to meet the needs of our community to ensure that individuals can receive the right supports, at the right time, and in the right place.

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ELI'S STORY

While in the midst of a brain health crisis, Eli Kraft and his parents did the right thing by seeking help at a local healthcare facility. Because Eli's concerns were not severe enough to meet hospital admission criteria, Eli and his family were left with nowhere to turn and no supports. Thankfully, they were able to find information about the Children's Crisis Stabilization program at Easterseals. Tracey called and was able to get Eli admitted to the residential program located at Camp Sunnyside. Over the next five days, Eli and his family received intensive brain health treatment and a plan to support Eli to continue his work when he returned home.

Eli noted this about his progress, "Rome wasn't built in a day, but I'm doing better and I keep working to be better."


