Thanks to WEHT Local and exceptional community support, the 39th annual Easter Seals Telethon on April 10 achieved a record-setting "final tote" of \$1,047,592 to fund therapy.

Activities at the Easter Seals Rehabilitation Center included the popular cruise-in and cookout by the E'ville Iron Street Rod Club, games and clowns at the Valero fishbowl, and hundreds of volunteers and supporters. The broadcast featured interviews, check presentations, and compelling Easter Seals Representative videos created by *Direction by Newman* in cooperation with WEHT Local/Local 7 WTVW.

Holiday World hosts 24th Play Day.

May 11 was a special day for ground 3,000 area children with disabilities, their teachers and chaperones—it was Play Day at Holiday World! During the annual event, the park opens only for kids with special needs and their school groups. Holiday World provides a substantial ticket discount to make Play Day affordable for schools, and the park generously donates all admission fees to Easter Seals!

This year, Holiday World's gift of approximately \$34,000 will fund therapy services and ongoing improvements to fully accessible playgrounds at the Easter Seals Rehabilitation Center and Milestones.

Work is now in progress on projects funded by last year's event. Those renovations will be completed this summer at our therapeutic preschool play area, called "Will's Way" playground in memory of former Holiday World & Splashin' Safari President Will Koch. Will was the driving force behind the park's commitment to Play Day. Since the first event in 1993, Holiday World has donated nearly \$404,600 in proceeds to Easter Seals!

The limited number of visitors on Play Day allows Holiday World staff to give extra attention and

Ethan works to reach goals for school, sports, and life.

Ethan M. was still an infant when his parents realized he was falling behind developmentally. As other babies learned to smile, grasp objects, roll over, and crawl, Ethan struggled to make progress.

Ethan's parents knew where to turn for help. His older brother had delays, too, and he had made great progress at a special place—the Easter Seals Rehabilitation Center in Evansville.



Ethan started therapy before his first birthday and is now 4 years old. His mom Jessica brings him to the Easter Seals Rehabilitation Center twice a week. She said it's well worth the drive from their home in Henderson, KY. "They have the knowledge and the equipment we couldn't find anywhere else," Jessica said. "And everyone really cares. We form relationships with our therapists here."

In addition to developmental delays, Ethan also has sensory issues that can make it difficult for him to complete tasks. Easter Seals therapists have helped Ethan reach many goals, from playing with toys and using markers to walking independently.

As he prepares to enter school, therapy focuses on new goals, like building strength, climbing stairs without help, running and jumping without falling, and Ethan's favorite—learning skills he'll need to play soccer!




Each week, Ethan works with his Easter Seals Physical Therapist Kristin Forrest on balance, coordination, core strength, and walking.

Retired president Ray Raisor honored at Tribute Dinner.

Ray Raisor retired in May 2015 after nearly 34 years as president of the Easter Seals Rehabilitation Center. More than 260 friends, family members and supporters gathered at the 2016 Tribute Dinner on June 8th to recognize Ray for his positive impact on Easter Seals and our community.

Under Ray's leadership, the range of programs available for local individuals with disabilities increased dramatically. Inclusive child care, aquatic therapy, supervised group living, and assistive technology were all introduced during his tenure. The organization grew from 33 employees and an annual budget of \$750,000 in 1982, to 341 employees and an annual budget of \$17.5 million last year.

At the Tribute Dinner, a video feature produced by WEHT Local/Local 7 WTVW celebrated Ray and his achievements. He received the annual "Changing Lives" Award and became the first recipient of the new "Ray Raisor 'Spirit of Innovation and Impact' Award." In the future, the award bearing Ray's name will honor staff members for exceptional ideas and actions that significantly impact the Easter Seals Rehabilitation Center and the people we serve.
