The Easterseals Rehabilitation Center is honored to be selected as the very first recipient of the United Leasing & Finance Championship "Golf Gives Back" Impact Grant.

The extremely generous \$50,000 award was announced on Jan. 16 with a press conference at our 621 S. Cullen Ave. location, home of the Easterseals Milestones early care and education program.

Thanks to Golf Gives Back, that location will also be the home of a wide-ranging arts program for children of all abilities. It will be centered around the Golf Gives Back Enrichment Studio, which will be created from existing classroom space.



Walker Vaught loves to run, jump, and have fun with his friends. That might not sound unusual for a 5-year-old. But when Walker was born, doctors didn't know if he would ever do those things—or if he would even learn to sit up or speak.

Walker was born without a cerebellum, a part of the brain that controls balance, coordination and learning. He's also been diagnosed with other disabilities. As a baby, Walker's special needs overwhelmed his day care provider. His parents, Dirk and Tina, both needed to work. They didn't know where to turn. Then they found Easterseals.

Walker has blossomed with Easterseals Rehabilitation Center therapy services, and he thrives with kids of all abilities at Easterseals Milestones. He's friendly and energetic and he loves his teachers and classmates.

Walker is working hard on skills he'll need to enter kindergarten next year. He will also need help reaching new goals in the future. Easterseals services will be here for Walker and his family every step of the way!

Tim Bowling

As a child, Tim Bowling got a great start in life by attending the Easterseals Rehabilitation Center's therapeutic preschool. Tim has cerebral palsy and like thousands of other local kids, Easterseals is where he learned to reach important developmental goals.

Tim went on to succeed in school, become involved in youth ministry, run his own computer business, and raise a family. He never guessed that Easterseals would again become a big part of his life. But in 2013, Tim fell at work and received a severe concussion that caused long-term pain and cognitive issues. In 2014, he had two strokes, one followed by seizures, which affected his mobility, balance and coordination.

Now at age 47, Tim is back at the Easterseals Rehabilitation Center to regain the skills he lost. He receives therapy in the gym and the fully-accessible warm-water therapeutic pool to manage pain and build strength and endurance.

Tim is determined and is making great progress toward his goals, which include returning to work and volunteering with youth in our community.
