# Parenting Tip of the Month!

Turning Pink? Unprotected skin can be damaged by the sun's UV rays in as little as 15 minutes. Yet, it can take up to 12 hours for skin to show the full effect of sun exposure. So, if your child's skin looks "a little pink" today, it may be

burned tomorrow morning. To prevent further burning, get your child out of the sun. Remember to seek shade, cover-up, wear a hat and sunglasses, apply and reapply sunscreen whenever you're outside this summer! Children under 6 months, should never be exposed to direct sunlight.



# **Food Fun**

Apple Ladybug Treats

"Red apples are decorated to look like lady bugs. This is a quick and fun snack that kids will enjoy making and eating. For once kids can play with their food."

Ingredients

- 2 red apples
- 1/4 cup raisins
- 1 tablespoon peanut butter
- 8 thin pretzel sticks

### Directions

1. Slice apples in half from top to bottom and scoop out the cores using a knife or melon baller. If you have an apple corer, core them first, then slice. Place each apple half flat side down on a small plate.

2. Dab peanut butter on to the back of the 'lady bug', then stick raisins onto the dabs for spots. Use this method to make eyes too. Stick one end of each pretzel stick into a raisin, then press the other end into the apples to make antennae.



# **Health and Safety**

Summer is a great time to get outside an play! However more time spent outside in the warm weather also increases exposure to bugs and bug bites. Here are some tips!

- When outside, cover children with lightweight clothing and use mosquito netting over strollers and infant seats. Also check your child for ticks at the end of the day if they have been playing outside.
- If you find a tick on your child, use tweezers and pull the tick off of the skin by its head. If you suspect the tick has been embedded for longer than 24 hours, contact your pediatrician.
- When choosing bug repellent, know that many products contain DEET. Research has shown that products with a DEET concentration of less than 30% is safe for children, but is NO amount of DEET is safe for babies under 2 months old.
- Apply bug repellent once a day and do not use a combination sunscreen/bug repellent.
- All-natural bug repellents such as lemon eucalyptus and citronella should NOT be used on children younger than 3 years old, though they may be safe for older children.

### **Top 5 Benefits of Self Care**

Specifically, you treat yourself like you matter and have intrinsic value. This can go a long way toward discouraging negative self-talk and your critical inner voice.
- **Increased self-knowledge.** Practicing self-care requires thinking about what you really love to do. The exercise of figuring out what makes you feel passionate and inspired can help you understand yourself a lot better. Sometimes, this can even spark a change in career or a reprioritization of previously abandoned hobbies.
- More to give. When you're good to yourself, you might think you're being selfish. In truth, self-care gives you the resources you need to be compassionate to others as well. Giving compassion is a bit like filling a bucket; you can't fill someone else's if you don't have enough of your own!




