

## Join us for this interactive and comprehensive training!

This 4-day professional development course for professionals who work with AAC users will focus on more advanced skills for those who are already implementing augmentative and alternative communication in their school. Participants will focus on skills to enhance their practice with beginning, emergent and more advanced communicators through further practice of techniques learned in the past as well as through analysis of case studies.

Additional focus will be on funding, access methods,

- Assessment more information on assessing complex communication needs and how to matching learners to communication systems and access methods to use those systems
- Funding review of funding mechanisms and writing funding reports
- Literacy the importance of literacy instruction regardless of communication competency will be discussed as will techniques to increase access to reading and writing for all learners
- IEP Goals and Data Collection we will look at ways to write *meaningful* augmentative communication goals and collect data on those goals
- Training formulate a plan to train others to be more effective communication partners

Learning Objectives:

- Participants will increase their skills in assessing learners with complex communication needs
- Participants will identify the components of an effective application for funding
- Participants will identify three ways to increase reading and writing skills in AAC users
- Participants will write a measurable, attainable and meaningful IEP goal and determine a method of data collection
- Participants will create a training plan and materials to increase the skills of those who interact with AAC users in their schools
