Easterseals Oregon Programs

Summer Camp: Camp Easterseals creates an environment that emphasizes the campers' abilities and independence, as well as the development of their social skills and appreciation and knowledge of the outdoors. Participants make friends, learn about and explore nature, sing songs around the camp fire, gain confidence, and create memories that will last a lifetime. Camp Easterseals offers two 5-day, 4-night sessions in July at Evans Creek Retreat, about 30 miles outside of Salem.



Senior Community Service Employment Program: The SCSEP program is for older adults who seek employment and training assistance, as well as civic engagement. Through this transitional employment program, Easterseals partners with community-based non-profit organizations and government agencies (host agencies) to provide participants with training opportunities to update their skills. During time in SCSEP, job seekers work with Easterseals staff to target and achieve personal employment goals.



Connecting Communities Program: Connecting Communities provide services that are individualized to help minorities that speak English as a second language in Oregon receive services that are essential to their employment success. The program offers workshops for job applications, practicing interviewing, the American Working Culture, English classes, computer classes and other employment services.



Supportive Services for Veteran Families Program: SSVF is funded by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. Easterseals Oregon administers SSVF in Marion and Polk Counties. The program provides supportive services for low or very low-income veteran families residing in or transitioning to permanent housing.



Homeless Veteran Reintegration Program: HVRP provides services that assist veterans who are at risk of experiencing homelessness to reintegration in the community and into meaningful employment within the labor force. We offer a structured, individually designed case management plan to assist the veteran to become employable and self sufficient.
