Last year, Easterseals decided to focus on how small actions can have big impact. We have always celebrated the small things because we know that for the children we serve, a small success is often not only the result of hard work, but also the pathway to continued success.

As we faced another year of uncertainty, by keeping our focus on the power of small actions, we knew that collectively, we could have big impact. And we did.

In January, we launched a Quarterly Town Hall series designed to engage, inspire and inform the community. Topics included the power of gratitude, inclusion and health equity and featured diverse and engaging guest speakers. The series serves as the launching point for finding new ways to connect with the community in impactful and meaningful ways.

As a country, we faced events and crisis that put a spotlight on how much work there is do be done with implicit bias and the pervasive impact it has. As an organization, we are working together to make a change. We have engaged Andrea Lawful-Sanders to help facilitate that change. Ms. Lawful-Sanders is highly regarded and recognized for her work in advocacy for children and families as well as her efforts to eliminate racism and empower women. She is actively working and connecting with the entire Easterseals team by facilitating ongoing communication to foster personal and professional development.

In December, author and philanthropist MacKenzie Scott made an unrestricted transformational gift to Easterseals of Southeastern Pennsylvania. The funds from this gift will allow us to expand our services to meet the increasing needs of community we serve. Easterseals was selected to receive this gift, according to Ms. Scott, because of a "track record of effective management and significant impact in their area of expertise." Her careful vetting process is also intended to serve as a recommendation to others looking to support an organization "well-positioned to accelerate progress." The impact of this gift will last for many years to come.

In June, Easterseals hosted a hybrid Walk With Me event. For the first time in two years, over 350


people spent a beautiful Saturday morning at the Philadelphia Zoo. We celebrated our Honorary Ambassadors whose stories are our
