The release of final rules to the Rehabilitation Act of 1974 (Section 503) and the Vietnam Era Veterans' Readjustment Assistance Act (VEVRAA) represent game-changing accomplishments in our country's effort to improve the employment picture for people with disabilities, who regularly face double digit unemployment, and for veterans who continue to struggle to return to the workforce.
