



## Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program U.S. Department of Labor 115th Congress

### The Need

Veterans are at a higher risk of becoming homeless or to live in poverty than the general U.S. population. The National Center on Homelessness among Veterans report on the prevalence of homelessness among U.S. Veterans found that veterans are overrepresented in the U.S. homeless population compared to the general population by a factor of two, and by a factor of three when compared to the population living in poverty. In addition, young Iraq (OIF) and Afghanistan (OEF) veterans and female veterans are at two times greater risk to become homeless than their non-veteran counterparts. Employment that provides a living wage is key to preventing and ending homelessness among all Americans, including veterans. A federal strategic plan to prevent and end homelessness found that unemployment, under-employment, and low wage employment are frequent causes of homelessness.

### U.S. Department of Labor's Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program



Recognizing that employment is a key and fundamental component of ending homelessness, Congress created the Homeless Veterans' Reintegration Program (HVRP) at the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL). HVRP is the only federally funded, national program that targets employment and training for homeless veterans. Through the program, community-based organizations use a holistic case management approach to provide and coordinate a wide array of services to help them return to the workplace. HVRP,

which serves about 17,000 veterans annually, has been one of the tools our country has used to help reduce veteran homelessness by nearly 50 percent since 2010. However, the remaining veterans, who include the chronically homeless, will require more time and greater access to HVRP's intensive, veteran-centered case management approach.
