As we begin 2022 thinking about diversity, equity and inclusion, and the tremendous impact it has on our shared community, one first has to ensure there is equal access. Many of the strategic initiatives in our 2022 Vision and Impact Plan address that very issue — Access! I am so happy to share with you just a few examples of how Easterseals is increasing access to services for the disability community, making sure everyone feels 100% empowered and 100% included.

**Adult Day Services** is expanding its technology and virtual content lending library, enabling all of our participants access to high quality content anytime, from anywhere.

**Autism Services** is addressing the gap in access to therapy services for low-income and communities of color, making sure families get timely diagnoses and therapy referrals.

**Child Development Services** will be opening up a new, state-of-the-art child development center in North San Diego in order to serve more low-income children with quality education.

**WorkFirst Employment Services** is expanding its Customized Employment program to find meaningful employment for individuals with disabilities.

**Living Options** will be welcoming new participants to a home in Bellflower, providing an opportunity to live independently and gain access to the local community.

This need for unfettered access is core to full inclusion. We couldn't provide this level of access to the individuals we serve each and every day without your generous support. I look forward to your continued partnership this year as we make these 2022 goals a reality.

The Grand Re-Opening of ESSC's Child Development Center in Ventura hosted an event to showcase the renovations and expansion of the center—including the outdoor classroom and garden.

Over 100 guests enjoyed tours of the newly renovated specialized rooms, including the outdoor classroom curated by Garden by Eatin'. The event welcomed dignitaries from the City of Ventura along with speaker, Lupe Trevizo-Reinoso, ESSC VP of Living Options, who not only shared the impact CDS centers have had in her life, but also the impact the new center has on the community of Ventura.



The Strides for Disability 3K Family Fun Walk, took place in October and started with a surprising morning of rain, but didn't keep over 600 walkers and volunteers from showing-up in support of ESSC's programs and services.

To keep everyone safe, all registered participants received individual swag bags with shirts, medal, racer bib, sunglasses and other goodies. Our volunteers from Kids Can Cosplay were on hand to add some fun to the soggy morning. The annual event raised over \$106,000, again proving it's an ESSC community favorite!

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## ACCESS: Phil's Story

For participants in Easterseals Southern California's Senior Day Services in Brea, music is one of the highlights of their day. The music does not come from the radio or from a streaming service but from their fellow participant, Phil.

"My father did not play his saxophone for forty years," shared his eldest daughter, Beth. "So you can imagine our surprise when he began to play again and remembered how to play so effortlessly."

Growing up in Italy, Phil spent his youth playing the saxophone in school. As an adult, his musical talent led him to perform on cruise ships across the Caribbean. It was then that he met his wife, and together they immigrated to the United States and raised three children. During this time, Phil's love of music lay dormant as his priorities shifted to adjusting to a new country and raising his family.

It was not only the amount of time that had passed since he had last played that made his musical talent a surprise, but for the past ten years, Phil has lived with Alzheimer's disease. A condition affecting one's memory, Alzheimer's has provided a multitude of challenges with his recollection and ability to navigate on his own.

"As the Alzheimer's progressed, my family and I knew we needed to find support but we were lost on where to start," Beth shared. "It was such a relief when we found out about Easterseals Senior Day Services. After speaking with the Easterseals team, we no longer felt alone in this situation and were so grateful that there were programs and people to support families like ours."

Most days, Phil treats Easterseals associates and fellow participants to a 30-minute concert of classic jazz songs. Performing has sparked a fire in him, reigniting the love he had for music in his youth. At home, his family shares that he practices two to three times a day. For many individuals with Alzheimer's, engaging in activities and hobbies can provide personal agency and enhance their quality of life.

For Phil and his family, the Senior Day Services fills an important gap. It gives Phil the opportunity to connect with other participants and associates in a structured and safe environment while providing his family with the peace of mind that he is cared for during the workday.


