Delivers individual and group training to associates. Assesses associates skill and provides feedback to management. Maintains training schedule.

Minimum Qualifications:

1. Master's degree in one of the following disciplines: early childhood education/development, early childhood special education, special education, psychology or related field.
2. Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) preferred.
3. Five years' experience using principles and techniques in behavior analysis with children with autism and related disorders. Expertise in approaches to intervention based on the science of Applied Behavior Analysis.
4. Expert knowledge and experience with behavior analysis teaching/training techniques used in organizational settings.
5. Familiar with the approaches to intervention based on the science of Applied Behavior Analysis found to benefit children with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD); competent in employing and directing behavior analytic methodologies; knowledgeable in the Verbal Behavior Milestones Assessment and Placement Program (VB-MAPP) and other assessment measures; well-versed in current related research findings.
6. Expertise in all empirically evaluated assessment and intervention strategies related to program and service delivery for individuals with ASD.
