Special Education

254 students served

The Wayne & Nicole Cypen School, encompassing two child development centers, the elementary and middle school academy, and the culinary arts high school, provides expert and focused help for children with autism and other special needs. This support enables them to reach their fullest potential and make progress on their journey toward independence.



Adult Day Care

130 families served

Older adults and seniors with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias (AD/ADRD) spend their days in our centers with our caring staff while their caregivers work. This enables them to return to their families every evening, rather then living in a nursing home or assisted living facility.



Head Start

488 children served

Provides high-quality, early-childhood education to preschool children living in low-income communities at 6 centers. Promotes school readiness by enhancing children's cognitive, social, and emotional development. Provides support to families in the areas of education, mental health, and social services.



In-Home Respite

100 families served

Provides in-home assistance for elders too frail to leave their homes, lightening the stressful and often detrimental burden shouldered by their caregivers. This allows the family to continue living together under the same roof, as they envisioned they would.




Military & Veteran Services

Meet Ethan



Ethan, a 10-year-old boy with autism, attends the Easterseals Academy and is currently in the fourth grade. He has been part of our school family since he was 6 years old and has shown remarkable progress in his development. When Ethan first joined us, he struggled with regulating his emotions and interacting with others. He avoided group activities and did not socialize with peers, often finding it difficult to tolerate them being in his space. However, during his time at Easterseals, Ethan has gradually integrated himself into the group. He now willingly participates in social games and activities, has developed strong relationships with his peers, and demonstrates the ability to take turns and share materials. In the classroom, Ethan is a valuable helper who consistently sets a positive example for his peers. He adheres to the rules and engages enthusiastically in all activities. We are proud of Ethan's progress, and have every confidence that he will continue to achieve great things.

Daniela was born with complex medical issues and developmental delays. Consequently, she has encountered significant challenges in both medical and educational realms, leading to delays in her development. For years, she attended special education classes in public schools until being initially diagnosed with a learning disability, and eventually with Mowatt Wilson Syndrome. In 2017, Daniela participated in Easterseals South Florida's Culinary Summer Camp, igniting a passion for cooking. Over the past five years, she has received the essential resources and intervention she needs. Thanks to the support system from the Easterseals family, Daniela recently graduated from the program and is now starting a new internship at Nicklaus Children's Hospital.

Juan is an amazing student whose family moved to Miami from Colombia. Intially the change wasn't easy. Not only for Juan himself, but also for his family since they were new to the area. Juan was afraid of the new place, new school, and new teachers. After 2-3 days of him going to Easterseals, the family saw how he reacted in a positive way and was excited to wake every morning and go to school. He did really well making new friends and would leave home with the excitement of meeting them at school every morning. In the afternoon, on the way back home, he would let his family know everything about his day, his friends, and how much he liked his teachers. This made the transition easy and smooth, and we are so happy that Juan is achieving his milestones and thriving.

Myriam's family sought out Easterseals South Florida when she began suffering from Alzheimer's disease. One of her daughters had the privilege of attending a luncheon fundraiser where she saw first-hand the positive impact of Easterseals at that time – not knowing that 20 years later, their mother would benefit from their services. Easterseals has helped combat the loneliness often associated with this memory impairment. It has given their mom a loving community and a place where she feels loved and cared for. Easterseals also provides a much-needed respite for their elderly father who also has medical challenges of his own. Myriam started attending Easterseals in 2018. She loves dancing to cumbia from her native Colombia with her friends at Easterseals. The staff provides her such joy and moments of happiness at a time when she most needs them.


