## ETHNIC CUISINE: YOUVARLAKIA

This simple but satisfying meatball soup from Greece is pretty easy to prepare, but takes some time. We made the meatballs with ground beef, chopped onions, long-grain rice, fresh chopped flat-leafed parsley, and eggs for binding. Each meatball was about $1 / 2$ inch in diameter, but we weren't trying to be precise. To the clear chicken broth, we added some beaten egg yolks, lime juice for tartness, chopped carrots, and celery.
