
Easterseals Tennessee Supported Living program provides 24/7 in-home care as well as Enabling Technology homes which are based on a member's abilities and preferences.

His daily routine with his two roommates has progressed Michael's socialization experiences and offered him companions to participate in daily activities at home and in the community. With continued progress, Michael's confidence has increased, and he has been reaching his goals. Michael has a new ambition of obtaining employment. With the aid of the Supported Employment program, he has been given the chance to research job opportunities and is looking forward to earning an income.

Michael's inquisitive nature and love of life drives him towards even greater independence and inclusion. Currently, he is working closely with staff to become his own conservator and take care of his finances. He is already budgeting his savings so he can participate in more activities and community events. He and his staff are currently pursuing options available to him through the Enabling Technology program. With assistive technology, Michael will be able to handle multiple tasks in his daily life all on his own, which will increase his self-reliance. He recently purchased a cell phone and is using it to connect with family and friends as well as research topics that interest him. Other options available to Michael are managing his own medications with an automatic dispenser, reminders for responsibilities and chores, as well as unlimited access to videochat with an Easterseals Tennessee staff member by using an iPad. Technology will help Michael to reach the independence he wants and still receive the support needed.

In 1999, Mr. Ayers established the Ayers Foundation, which supports a wide range of programs and institutions with an emphasis on education and rural counties. To date, the Ayers Foundation has awarded over \$20 million in scholarships to graduating high school seniors, assisting almost 30,000 students in rural areas. Since its inception, postsecondary rates in these counties have exceeded the state and national averages, illustrating how Mr. Ayers advocacy is truly improving lives.
