Early Intervention: Helping Families Reach Their Goals

Easterseals Tennessee provides developmental therapy to more than 125 young children, birth to four years old, and their families. Families with children with developmental delays, prematurity, or disabilities can receive this service through the Tennessee Early Intervention System at no cost to them or their insurance.

Easterseals' team of Early Interventionists meet one on one with families in their natural environment (home, childcare center, park) to help identify the family's goals, routines to learn new skills, and interventions/strategies to assist the child.

Kimberly Erickson, one of the Early Interventionists with Easterseals TN has worked with one of the families since the child was six months old and was referred due to being born ten weeks premature. During a recent therapy session, the child's mother shared benefits her family has experienced. "We have been able to keep an eye on him as a whole. We have been through rolling over, crawling, and first steps. Now that he is two and a half years old, the next goal is potty training." Kimberly has supported the family by helping them understand developmental appropriate milestones and problem solving ways to use the family's routines (mealtime, bath time, bedtime, playing) to learn new skills. "We are so thankful for Early Intervention! It has been invaluable."

Easterseals TN Autism Therapy Services Grows in Lebanon and the Cleveland TN Communities



Easterseals TN is growing to meet the needs in underserved communities. In October 2022, Easterseals TN opened an Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) therapy center in Lebanon. The location supports center-based ABA for children 18 months to five years and community-based ABA for children five years and older. Recently a partnership was established with Trousdale County Schools to provide behavior analysis services for students in this rural community.

In November, another ABA therapy center opened in Cleveland, TN. This is the

third ABA location across the state and there is excitement about the impact this center will have in the local community. By Summer 2023, there are plans to continue to grow the centers by adding additional BCBAs and RBTs to serve more clients at all sites across Tennessee. Easterseals TN Establishes a Self-Advocacy Committee


