Easterseals of Greater Waterbury, Central and Northwest


Connecticut was recently the recipient of an incredibly generous planned gift from Henry L. Long, Jr. of Watertown.

Henry Long was a generous, respected community member who served on Easterseals Board of Directors from 1974-1980. He enthusiastically helped to lead Easterseals fundraising efforts from the mid 1970's through the 1990's. He served as chairman of many Easterseals major fundraising initiatives, including the Waterbury Area Easter Seal Telethon and the Ham-O-Shanter Golf Tournament. In June of 1994, Easterseals was honored to recognize Mr. Long for

20 years of outstanding volunteer service. He was known for his constant, sometimes wild, sense of humor and had a very special way of engaging members of the community to become involved with and give back to support Easterseals mission.


Henry Long wished to extend his generosity beyond

Suffering from Vertigo? Easterseals Medical Rehabilitation Program can help

Liz is a driven, goal-oriented woman who has overcome many challenges in her life. At a very young age she was diagnosed with intellectual disabilities which impaired her cognitive functioning. She has worked hard for many years to learn to live independently and gain meaningful employment at a job that she loves. When Liz suddenly started to feel dizzy all the time, she was extremely worried about how this would affect her daily work routine. Liz said, "I love my job, but I had a hard time working when I was dizzy." In November 2021, Liz was struggling to stand for long periods of time at her retail job. She would feel dizzy anytime she bent over to pick up something and was struggling to sleep through the night. Having worked so hard to finally find a job she loved, Liz was at risk of losing it if she was unable to perform her tasks. She thought her dizziness might have been related to seizures that she had in the past, recalls Liz. Her primary physician diagnosed her with vertigo, a sensation that the environment around you is spinning in circles. He referred Liz to Easterseals Medical Rehabilitation Program in Meriden.

Mindy Fricke, a Physical Therapist and Certified Vestibular Therapist with Easterseals is expertly trained to treat vertigo. Liz and her mom came to her first appointment unsure of what to expect. "Mindy flipped me upside down!" says Liz. Mindy was actually performing

the Epley maneuver, which is a series of movements to dislodge crystals from the tubes in the inner ear so that you can regain balance. Part of this procedure has the patient lying flat on their back with their head suspended off the back of a medical table, or upside down.

After three visits with Mindy, Liz no longer experiences the symptoms of vertigo. She has been able to keep her job at Good Cause gifts, has been sleeping well at night, and is enjoying a life without dizziness. Liz says, "Mindy is a miracle worker! I have no issues and I am so thankful my vertigo hasn't returned."
