

Driver Assessment - Fact Sheet

What is a Comprehensive Driver Assessment?

· A Comprehensive Driver Assessment consists of a clinical and a behind the wheel assessment completed by a Certified Driver Rehab Specialist.

What is a Clinical Driver Assessment?

- A clinical assessment evaluates the visual, cognitive, and physical skills required to safely operate a motor vehicle.
 - · Identifies deficits if any that could affect safety behind the wheel

What is a Behind the Wheel Assessment?

- A behind the wheel assessment is completed in one of Easterseal's vehicles as they are equipped with a brake for the evaluator.
- · The client is given directions on where to drive and the evaluator assesses the client to see if the deficits identified in the clinical are apparent behind the wheel.

What are the possible outcomes of a Driver Assessment?

- Driving cessation
- · Return to driving without restrictions
- · Driving with restrictions (no night time, no highway, local driving only, etc)
- · Driving with restrictions for an allotted time period and returning for a reassessment to ensure continued safety if the you have a progressive diagnosis.

What is the cost of the assessment? (effective 1/1/24)

- Not covered by insurance.
 - · \$440 for the clinical
- · \$195 for the behind the wheel
- · \$275 for an adaptive behind the wheel
- \cdot \$275 for a reassessment (includes repeat cognitive testing and a behind the wheel)
