Camp Registration Policies and Procedures

WELCOME

At camp, children and adults have opportunities to build social skills, explore interests and talents, make friends and experience being part of a community. We know a summer at camp can open doors and change lives. That's why Easterseals Southeast Wisconsin and the Milwaukee County Office for Persons with Disabilities work hard to provide the best programs that create a safe and fun environment that is accepting to all. OUR CAMP PURPOSE

Our summer camps offer respite care for your child and provide a fun and safe environment where they can engage in activities with others. Our staff will adhere to any behavior plans in place and manage behaviors as needed, but this program is not considered to be a behavioral treatment program. We provide support for individuals in a group setting. It is the family's responsibility to provide one-on-one assistance if they feel their child will need the additional support to be successful at camp.

REGISTRATION

Applications will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis. Easterseals encourages you to register for respite camp early. There is a limit to how many campers can attend each camp session and there are no exceptions. Sign up today! **WE DO NOT ACCEPT FAXED APPLICATIONS.**

ACCEPTANCE

The plan to follow for acceptance into camp includes:

1. Filling out the respite camp application in this booklet and sending it to our West Allis office. Make sure nothing important is left blank.
2. If your case manager is assisting with funding for camp contact them about providing Easterseals with a written authorization or a service plan for your child.
3. If your child is accepted into camp, you will receive an acceptance letter in the mail, along with additional information pertaining to camp. If your child is waitlisted, you will be notified via a letter or phone call. If a spot opens up, you will be notified.
4. The Recreation Supervisor will meet with you and your

child to get to know more of their interests, allow you to share any behavioral concerns or additional support your child may need, and discuss how we can help your child be successful in our program. Our assessments typically take 15-30 minutes; however, we can always allow more time if you have additional questions. A member of our recreation staff will contact you within two days following the assessment to let you know whether or not your child has been accepted. Please note: Easterseals will NOT do in-home or in-school assessments for camp. Assessments must take place at an Easterseals site.

If you do not follow these steps in their entirety, your acceptance to camp may be delayed. Registrations come in quickly and the ones that come first, in completion, will fill the remaining camp spots.

CANCELLATION AND REFUNDS

The camp registration fee is nonrefundable, unless you are waitlisted or not accepted. If you are discharged from camp you will be considered for a prorated refund of the camp fee. Refund of camp fees are subject to evaluation of the situation on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be given no later than September 28th, 2018.

PAYMENT

The initial camp registration fee is due when the camp application is submitted. Your space will not be reserved without the appropriate registration fee and confirmation of payment or authorization of services. Families paying privately must complete the Private Pay section in the camp application. Camp fees will not be prorated. Your payment will be withdrawn on Friday, May 11th, 2018. If your camp fees will be paid by a funding source (Autism Waiver, Family Care, IRIS, DHHS, etc.), indicate the name, phone number and e-mail of your case manager on the application.

Please work closely with your case manager to acquire authorization for services. If we have not acquired authorization of services by May 11th, 2018, the camper may be moved to the wait list.

CAMP CHECKLIST

Every day campers are expected to bring a large bag or backpack filled with the following items:

- Lunch (cold lunch preferred)
- Sunscreen
- Insect Repellent
- Bathing Suit
- Towel
- Change of Clothes
- Personal Care Supplies
- Water Bottle
- Pool Shoes (optional)

LABELING

Please ensure that your camper is sent to program with appropriate clothing. Layers of light clothing to stay comfortable with the changing temperatures throughout the day are recommended. Due to the large number of campers at each site, please label all items with camper's initials! Staff will do their best to keep track of each camper's belongings, and will label if necessary.

ELIGIBILITY

The Easterseals Respite Camp is for individuals living with disabilities between ages 7-21. Completed applications are accepted on a first come, first serve basis; each camper must complete an assessment performed by Easterseals staff.

TRANSPORTATION

For Schuetze: You are responsible for your own transportation. Bus transportation will be provided to and from weekly field trips only.

REGARDING OUTINGS

Throughout the summer, campers will go on outings in the community. We always appreciate having extra helpers on outing days, so parents, guardians and adult friends are invited to join us as volunteers! If you'd like to volunteer for an outing, you will need to complete a volunteer application and provide your own transportation. **Bus transportation is provided for campers and required PCAs only.**

SIGNIFICANT MEDICAL NEEDS

We try to make accommodations so that almost everybody can come to camp. If your camper has significant medical needs, please have someone attend the Open House to assist CNA staff in becoming familiar with proper care techniques.

Some campers with significant medical needs have a Personal Care Assistant (PCA) attend camp daily to provide care. If PCA attendance is required or if you'd like to discuss other medical concerns, call Chelsea at (414)550-2294.

NEW APPLICANTS

As stated in our policies and procedures, following your registration, you should complete an assessment with Chelsea at (414)550-2294.

SCHUETZE FEE

The cost of Full Day Care (9:00am-4:30pm) is \$1,800. The fee covers field trips, art projects, t-shirt, water bottle and backpack. For additional hours and costs, see the Fee & Payment Information Page on the application. [A \$40 (City of Waukesha Resident 53186, 53187, 53188, 53189) or \$140 Non-resident non-refundable registration deposit is required with the application in order to process registration. Registration deposit does not count toward your camp balance.]

New for 2018

SPRING TRAINING

We are hosting a **mandatory** Spring Training day for our campers at each camp location. This will be included in the camp cost. Transportation will NOT be provided for Spring Training Day.

Parents are requested to **not** be in attendance in order to simulate a true camp day. The goal of this day is for Easterseals staff to be hands on and identify camper needs prior to the first day of camp. Campers will be provided a snack and engage in a variety of activities to help kick off the summer!

COMMUNICATION

Email

For general information and non-emergent updates, Easterseals staff will be contacting you via email. Please ensure the primary contacts' updated email address is listed on camper registration form. Please check your email on a daily basis for general communication including field trip reminders and schedule changes.

Each Site Leader will be checking their email daily. Please don't hesitate to contact staff through email for non-emergent matters including notices of absence.

Phone calls

For any immediate concerns or incidents including camper illness, behaviors, etc. Easterseals staff will be contacting you via phone.

Site Leaders may be contacted via phone for last minute changes in campers drop off/pick up schedule, or daily schedule updates. Please be aware that the focus of Easterseals staff is the safety and engagement of all of our campers throughout the camp day. Non-Emergent phone calls should be made to the camp Site Leader before or after the full camp day between 8:00am and 9:00am, 3:00pm and 4:00pm.

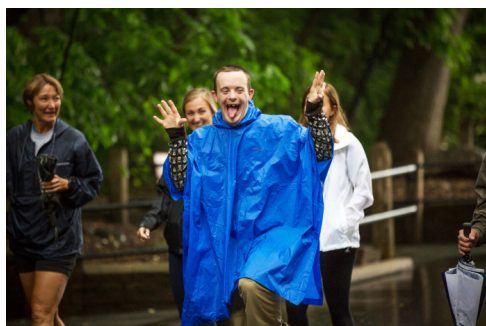
