Please be assured that your information will be held in strict confidence and will not be shared with any other organization or agency. We will only process applications for families in the following cities - Detroit, Highland Park, Hamtramck, River Rouge, Harper Woods, Ecorse & Redford. At the time of package pickup in December you will be asked to provide parent/guardian ID and ID for kids (MI Health Card OR birth certificate OR report card/communication from child's school). You can provide all ID by showing images in your phone. All eligible families will receive communication from the Detroit Goodfellows in August to confirm your information and again in early December via US mail and email to provide pickup information. WINTER WARMING CENTERS

Three overnight warming centers are open now through March 31, 2024. These centers provide two meals, showers, sleeping accommodations, and housing assistance for residents experiencing homelessness.

- Cass Community Social Services Serves families and single women
- **<u>Detroit Rescue Mission Ministries</u>** Serves families and single women
- **Detroit Rescue Mission Ministries** Serves single males

To access these warming centers, residents should call 866-313-2520 from 8am – 6pm Monday – Friday. Veterans seeking shelter should call from 8am – 4:30pm.
