

# The Voice Box New Motor Speech Lab is One-of-a-Kind

Easter Seals DuPage & Fox Valley kicked off the New Year with a ribbon cutting ceremony for The Voice Box: A Motor Speech Lab. This innovative addition to the Speech-Language department provides an all-inclusive approach to assessing and treating children with voice, resonance, oral motor and articulation disorders.

This high-tech lab uses cutting-edge equipment that provides visual and tactile feedback. The SmartPalate pairs a child's custom, molded mouthpiece with a computer program that reinforces positive speech patterns through fun and motivating games. One such game uses an animated frog to encourage louder speech, while another lights up to reward correct tongue placement.

Speech-language pathologists use their clinical expertise to review objective data and measure progress. These detailed results allow them to identify vocal pathologies and develop the best treatment plan for each child.

"These technologies help us stay at the forefront of therapeutic care as we respond to the changing needs of the children we serve," said Theresa Forthofer. "We are proud to offer the only speech motor resonance lab in the Chicago area and are grateful to the 2013 Benefit Gala paddle raise donors who made it possible."


### Tellabs Makes Tele-Therapy Possible

# Word Wizards


In July the inaugural Word Wizards Speech Team, for kids ages seven to 18-years-old, showcased their talents. The program was founded by Glenbard West High School senior, Abbey Burgess. Abbey is not only a member of her high school speech team but has attended Easter Seals since she was six-months-old. When she discussed the idea with their fellow speech teammates, her peers did not need much convincing.

"They were immediately all over it," Abbey said. "It was so cool for me to see how enthusiastic and excited they were."

The program included 10 children working with the Glenbard West students for six weeks. At the final showcase, children chose a poem, song or original speech to perform. Topics included everything from mythical creatures to sleepovers, fun and friendship.




