






- We provided 134 individuals with the opportunity to attend multiple respite camp weekends, ensuring that caregivers had a break from the rigors of 24 hour care giving.
- Our child development center continues to grow, currently serving 120 children, and this year achieved a Q4 rating by the Department of Health and Human Services IQ4K, making it possible for more children to enter the school system kindergarten ready.
- Our Outpatient Brain Health Program continues to grow, helping to fill the gap in mental health therapy available to lowans, this year serving 238 children and adults.



- Our Crisis Stabilization Program is filling a critical need for emergency brain health services for select central lowa communities. Last fiscal year 394 children and adults were supported through this life-saving program.
- 100 clients obtained a community-based job with our support.


