Easterseals invites elementary and preschool teachers to utilize Tools 4 Teaching presents “Easterseals HOP-N-ING!” New doll will help kids understand that some disabilities aren’t visible.

Kids have fun at school *and* learn valuable life lessons with Tools 4 Teaching presents “Easterseals HOP-N-ING!” The week-long disability awareness program can be used at no cost by elementary school teachers any time during the school year, or year-round for preschool and other groups.



Materials include a curriculum guide and five dolls with disabilities. The dolls’ stories help students develop a better understanding of people with differing abilities. This year, a new doll named James, who depicts a child with autism, joins four other dolls with more visible disabilities.

Easterseals staff can present HOP-N-ING information to groups, classes, or in an assembly setting. Groups can also tour the Easterseals Rehabilitation Center to see how our services enable people with disabilities to live, learn, work, and play independently.

After learning about disabilities, children help to change lives *and* win prizes by collecting pledges for each hop completed during a 3-minute HOP-N-ING. Money raised provides therapy for local kids and adults.

Easterseals services help 4-year-old Zoie listen and learn.

A bird sings outside and 4-year-old Zoie Sims pauses from her playtime to listen. A bird's song is just one of many sounds that are new to Zoie, who received hearing aids through the Easterseals Rehabilitation Center earlier this year.

Zoie, the happy and observant daughter of George and Stacey Sims, was born with Down syndrome. Easterseals audiologists identified a slight hearing loss, as well, and began evaluating Zoie's hearing regularly. Over time, they determined that hearing aids could help Zoie understand directions, learn more effectively, and reach developmental milestones.

Zoie is still working up to full-time use of her hearing aids, but her family can already tell a difference. In addition to hearing birds and interacting more with her parents and teachers, Zoie is reacting more to music. "She loves music and is becoming more physical with it, moving to the music and not just listening," said Stacey.

Zoie's walking has also improved by leaps and bounds, thanks to custom orthotics from the Easterseals Rehabilitation Center. Lower leg splints provided stability as she learned to walk. "She recently graduated from splints and just has special inserts in her shoes to stabilize her arches and ankles," Stacey explained.

"Receiving services from the Easterseals Rehabilitation Center has just been a great experience," Stacey said. "Everyone is so welcoming and supporting. I could never thank them enough."



Occupational Therapy professionals help all ages achieve goals for daily living.

For 100 years, the profession of Occupational Therapy has helped children and adults with disabilities accomplish things they want and need to do every day. At the Easterseals Rehabilitation Center, our experienced OT staff helps hundreds of local people achieve their own goals each year.

Our Occupational Therapy professionals can help children with disabilities learn to grasp toys, print and write, eat a variety of foods, and get dressed without assistance. They may help adults with disabling conditions learn (or re-learn) to prepare meals, do household chores, use a computer keyboard, or drive independently. These are just a few examples of countless goals that can be achieved through Occupational Therapy.

Sessions may include using adaptive equipment such as special eating utensils, dressing devices, reachers, splints, pencil grips, vehicle hand controls, or other equipment.

Evaluations may include visits to a client's home, school or workplace. Occupational Therapy professionals may recommend adaptive equipment and can train clients, family members and caregivers in its use. The primary objective is always to meet the individual's personal goals for living, learning, working and playing in our community.

“Occupational Therapy practitioners have a holistic perspective, in which the focus is on adapting the environment to fit the person, and the person is an integral part of the therapy team.”

Our Occupational Therapists are licensed and most have specialized training in the areas of sensory integration and feeding issues for children. We are certified First Steps providers for infants and children up to age 3.
