





# Introduction

**Easterseals Child Development Centers (CDCs)** provide a comprehensive, inclusive child development program for children birth to 5 years of age, pregnant mothers, and families.

We believe quality early childhood education is the foundation for young children and will positively impact future generations. Through local, state and federal partnerships, along with committed staff, Easterseals is able to continually improve the lives of children and families through quality early child development services.

We strive to empower families and ensure that they have the tools needed to build a strong future for their children. Easterseals continually takes steps to improve family engagement in the child development services offered and works to develop positive relationships with the families enrolled. Our staff members maintain frequent contact with families to ensure that each child's individual educational needs are met at our centers and that each child's overall development is fostered at home.

Easterseals Southern California has operated Head Start, Early Head Start, California Department of Education and California Department of Social Services programs since 2002 in Ventura, San Bernardino and North San Diego Counties.

Easterseals receives funding from the Administration of Children and Families and the County of San Bernardino Preschool Services Department to operate Head Start, Early Head Start porgrams.

Additional services provided by Easterseals are State Preschool, General Child Care and U.S. Air Force Respite Services.

# Early Head Start

This is a federally funded program for children 0-3 years old and for pregnant women.

Program options for families are as follows:

- Center base—Full day/Full year (8-10 hours per day)
- ✓ Home base—Weekly visits with 2 socializations per month
- ✓ Family Child Care, hours vary

In 2020-2021, approximately 19% of children served had a disability.

## **Head Start**

This is a federally funded program for children 3-5 years old.

Program options are as follows:

- ✓ Center Base-Full day/Full year (10 hours a day)
- ✓ Center Base-Part day/128 days per year (3 ½ hours per day/4 days per week)
- Extended Day (8 hours per day/175 days per year)
- ✓ Home Base-Weekly visits with 2 socializations per month

In 2020-2021, approximately 14% of children served had a disability.

# Early Head Start-Child Care Partnership

This is a federally funded program for children 0-3 years old.

Program options are as follows:

✓ Center Base-Full Day/Full Year (8-10 hours a day)

## **Early Head Start**

Easterseals serves 330 infants and toddlers, ages 0-3, and pregnant women in Ontario and Upland (in San Bernardino County), in Ventura County, and in North San Diego County through a variety of program options including center base, home base and family child care homes. In 2020-2021, a total of 462 children (416 families) were served in this program and 25 pregnant mothers.

Easterseals serves 96 infants and toddlers in San Bernardino County with center base and home base programs in the cities of Upland, Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, Fontana, Chino and Montclair, through a contract with the County of San Bernardino. In 2020-2021, a total of 132 children (114 families) were served in this program.

# **Early Head Start-Child Care Partnership**

Easterseals serves 168 infants and toddlers in North San Diego County through the Early Head Start Child Care Partnership program through contracted partner agencies and family child care providers. In 2020-2021, a total of 226 children (198 families) were served in this program.

#### **Head Start**

Easterseals serves a total of 483 preschool children ages 3-5 in San Bernardino County with center base and home base services in the cities of Upland, Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, Fontana, Chino and Montclair. In 2020-2021, a total of 378 children (341 families) were served in these programs. Due to being closed because of the pandemic for in-person services until April 2021, families were not interested in virtual services which lowered enrollment numbers significantly.

Easterseals serves 171 preschool children in North San Diego County with center base and home base services in the cities of Encinitas and Solana Beach. In 2020-2021, a total of 224 children (212 families) were served in these programs.

- Policy Council/Committee: Governing group of parents and community representatives to provide shared decision making with the Board of Directors.
- Parent Advisory Committee: All parents enrolled at the CDC are a part of the Parent Committee, and assist with program decisions at the center level.
- Health Services Advisory Committee: All parents enrolled at the CDC are a part of the Parent Committee, and assist with program decisions at the center level.
- Parent Workshops: Resume Building workshops, as well as Interview Tip workshops were conducted helping parents get prepared to seek employment.
- The Week of the Young Child: The Week of the Young Child—A week dedicated to young children with activities that celebrate the importance and love of children.

As a result of the pandemic, during the Spring of the 2020-2021 program year, many of the parent involvement events that Easterseals previously held in-person were instead held via virtual formats such as Zoom meetings. The scheduling of virtual meetings has increased parent and community participation due to the easy access of logging in from homes and offices.

# **School Readiness**

asterseals Child Development Services prepare children for kindergarten and the years following. Various developmentally appropriate activities are planned and implemented within indoor and outdoor environments at each center every day that children attend. Easterseals staff conduct assessments for each child during these planned activities as well as classroom routines three times throughout the year, using the Desired Results Developmental Profile 2015 (DRDP 2015) Assessment.

In 2020-2021, Easterseals provide hybrid services to best meet the needs of the families. Due to COVID protocol, classrooms were required to keep the number of children and adults lower than the number of children enrolled in the classroom. Easterseals offered families the option to receive virtual services, if requested. San Bernardino County services were 100% virtual until April 2021 at the request of the county. Children and families receiving virtual services participated in daily activities using communication platforms such as Zoom meetings. The virtual lesson plans also required staff to follow up with families weekly to find out how the child responded to each activity suggested. During each phone, text or email communication, staff also checked-in with parents and family members to see what information and resources they needed to cope

with the struggles brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the virtual lesson plan conversations, staff were able to notify families of community resources, as well as, resources provided by Easterseals. Families were able to pick up learning materials, activity packets with art supplies, cleaning/hygiene items and food so that they were better able to maintain a stable home environment to support their children's learning and development. For families without reliable transportation, Easterseals staff coordinated safe drop-offs of needed materials on a regular basis.

Because of the frequent communication through drop off and pick up of virtual lesson plans and supply distribution during the Spring of the 2020-2021 program year. Easterseals staff members were still able to collect enough information to conduct observations of children's skills and abilities. Easterseals also invested in the family module of the application, Learning Genie. This application allowed families to share photos, videos and observations of their children at home with the teachers. The application also allowed teachers to share books and other electronic materials with families to use in the home.

The DRDP 2015 Assessment focuses on skills and abilities needed for kindergarten entry within five main learning domains. In 2020-2021, the School Readiness goals were as follows:

# Children Will... **Domains Physical** Children will demonstrate coordination of **Development** movements, including small and large and Health muscle control through eye-hand coordination, hand strength and dexterity. Children will practice healthy and safe habits on a routine basis. Social and Children will demonstrate positive **Emotional** social skills, interactions and emotional behaviors and abilities. **Development** Approaches to Children will participate in creative Learning and imaginative activities that provide ways to express thoughts, feelings and experiences in order to strengthen their abilities and knowledge in all areas of development. Language & Literacy Children will demonstrate an understanding of language and literacy. **Cognitive &** Children will participate in teacher and **General Knowledge** self-directed activities demonstrating initiative, curiosity, persistence, attentiveness and cooperation; and will gather information to analyze and solve problems that relate to their natural and

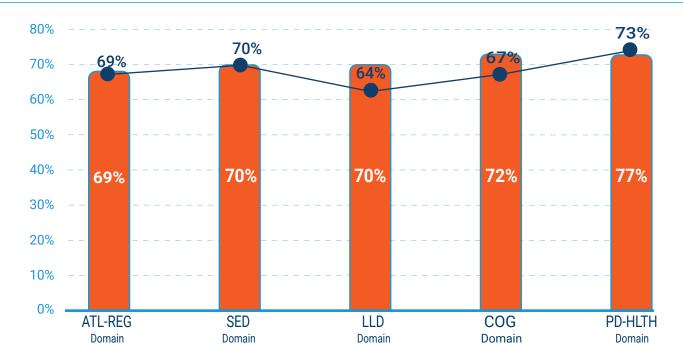

Children at or above Exploring Later **Assessment 1 vs. Assessment 2** 2020-2021 Program Year

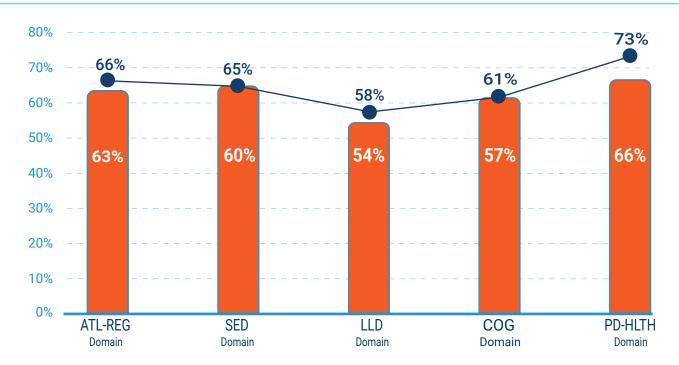




#### **Early Head Start Grantee Program**

Children At or Above Exploring Later **Assessment 1 vs. Assessment 3** 2019-2020 Program Year





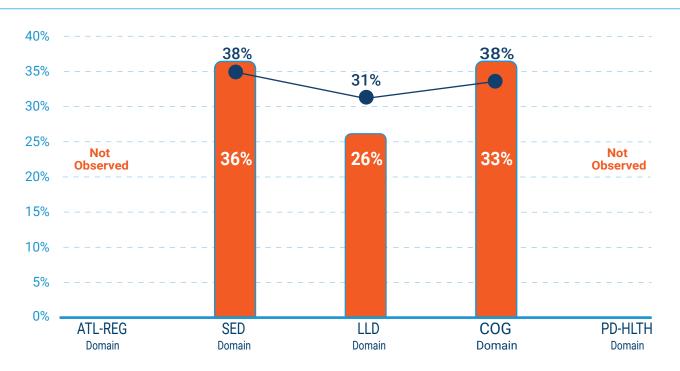


# **Inland Empire Early Head Start Delegate**

2020-2021 Program Year

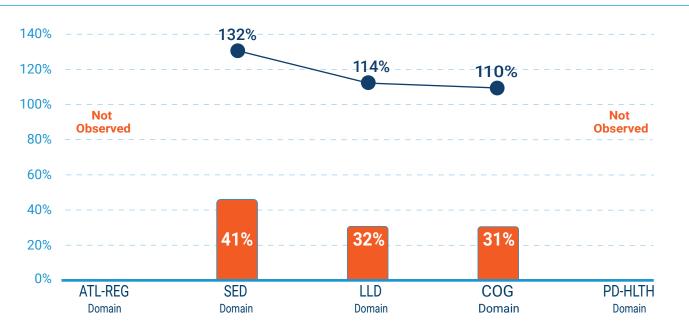




## **Inland Empire Head Start Delegate**

Children At or Above Exploring Later **Assessment 1 vs. Assessment 3** 2020-2021 Program Year







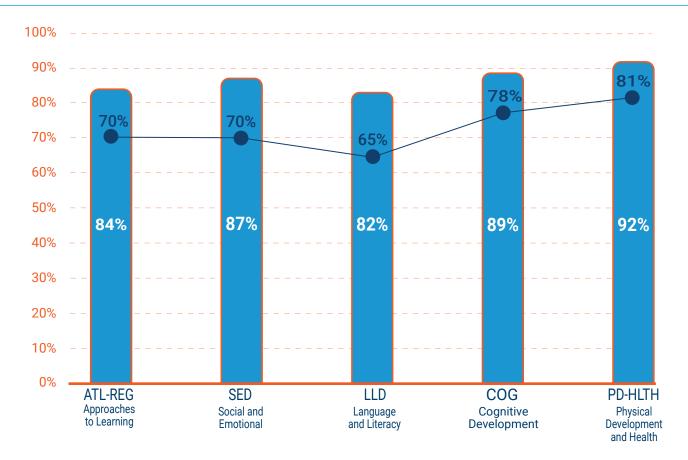
# North San Diego Early Head Start Grantee Program

2019-2020 Program Year



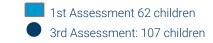


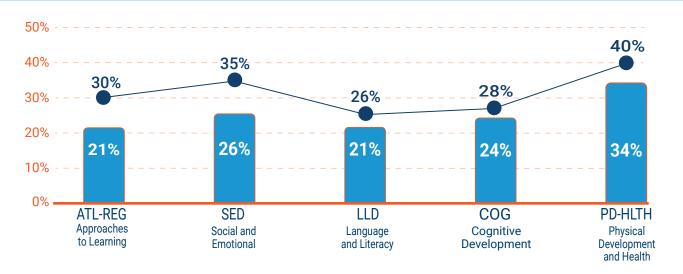

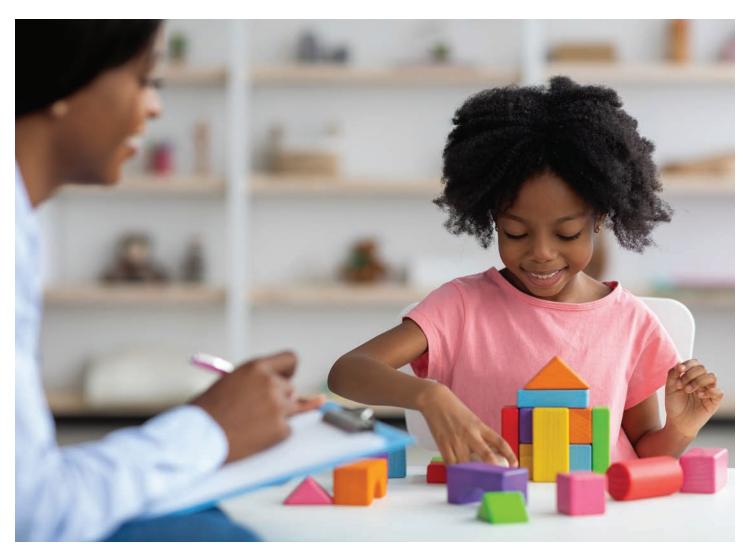
